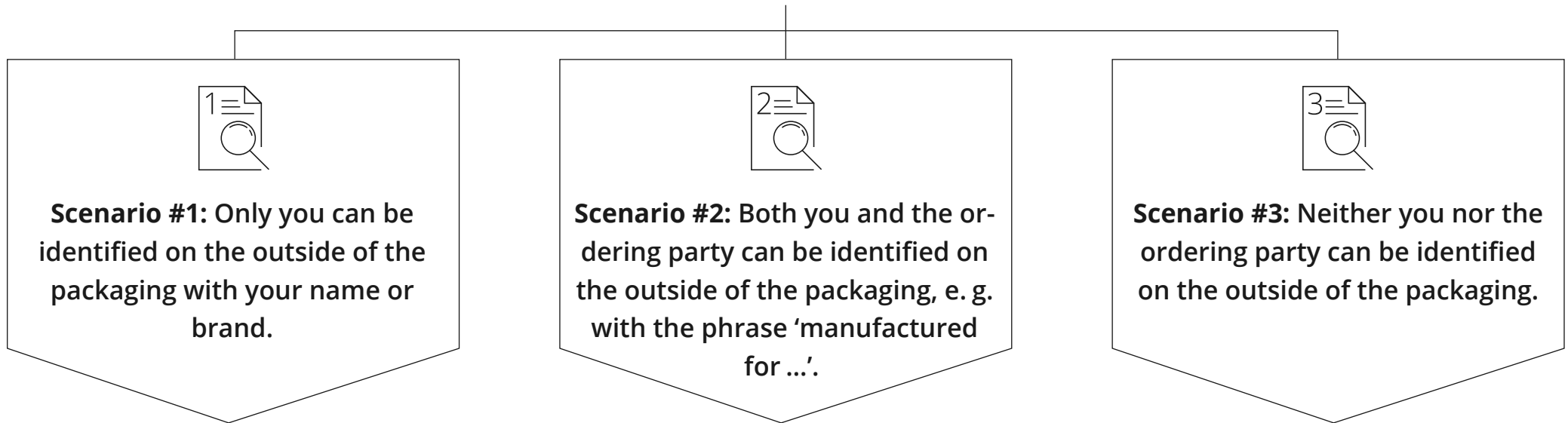


Packaging law obligations for contract packagers

1. Register with the LUCID Packaging Register.
2. Conclude a system participation agreement with a system operator. A list of system operators can be found here [↗](#).
3. Regularly report your packaging volumes to both your system operator and the LUCID Packaging Register (data reporting).

If the name of your company appears with the phrase 'manufactured for [name/brand of ordering party]', you are still the party under obligation within the meaning of the Verpackungsgesetz (Packaging Act).

Heads-up: The ordering party, e. g. the retail company, is only responsible for fulfilling the obligations under German packaging law if it is the sole party identifiable on the packaging.

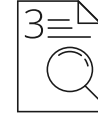
Packaging law obligations for contract packagers



Scenario #1: Only you can be identified on the outside of the packaging with your name or brand.



Scenario #2: Both you and the ordering party can be identified on the outside of the packaging, e. g. with the phrase 'manufactured for ...'.



Scenario #3: Neither you nor the ordering party can be identified on the outside of the packaging.

You are the party under obligation in all of these scenarios. Here's what you need to do:

- 1.** Register with the LUCID Packaging Register.
- 2.** Conclude a system participation agreement with a system operator. A list of system operators can be found here [↗](#).
